The Condition of the above Obligation is such, that Whereas the above Bound William Bishop is this day constituted and appointed Collector to Collect the Levy this day laid and assessed, Now therefore if the said William Bishop doth fully Collect and receive the levies this day laid and assessed and pay the same to the several Claimants to whom the same is lawfully due at the time prescribed and directed by Law, then the above Obligation to be void, or else to remain in full force and Virtue.
