To have and to hold the said Fifty Acres more or less and all houses
buildings orchards ways waters watercourses profits commodities and
hereditaments thereunto in any wise belonging or appertaining to him
the said Edward Brown and his heirs forever from henceforth claiming or
demand of them the said David Fentress and Peggy his wife do hereby
covenant to warrant to and defend the title of the said bargained premises
