acknowledged, hath granted bargained and sold, and by these presents doth  
grant bargain and sell unto the said John Smith his heirs and Assigns  
forever the before mentioned two tracts or parcels of Land with their  
and each of their appurtenances, the one containing four hundred  
and thirty four acres more or less which the said Thomas Newton

conveyed to the said Patrick Parker on the ninth day of June in  
the year one thousand seven hundred and ninety six, the other con  
taining two hundred acres more or less which the said Patrick Parker  
purchased of Richard E. Lee, as by the several deeds for the same  
revenue being thereunto had well more fully appear. To have and
