proper use & behoof forever; and I do hereby Release myself my heirs, Executors
& Administrators to warrant and defend the title & estate of the said Stock
Stock & furniture to my two said Daughters Dinah and Frances their heirs

This Indenture made the fifth day of October in the Year
of our Lord Eighteen hundred and one Between Isaac Scott
and Frances his wife of the County of Prince Anne, and Henry
Pallott and Susannah his wife of the Borough of Norfolk of the one
part, and Thomas Griffin Coach Maker of said Borough of Norfolk
of the other part, Whereas Isaac Lacy late of said County of Prince
Anne deceased was in his lifetime, and at the time of his death seized
and possessed in fee simple of a certain Tract or parcel of Land situate,
lying and being in said County of Prince Anne where he then resided
containing Seventy five Acres more or less according to the ancient, known,
and reputed bounds thereof, which He by his last Will and Testament
