for and in consideration of the sum of forty pounds current money of Vir-  
ginia to him in hand paid the receipt whereof I do hereby acknowledge have  
bargained, sold and delivered, and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell,  
alien and confirm unto the aforesaid Margaret Robinson and to her  
heirs and Assigns forever One certain parcel or tract of Land containing  
Eight Acres be the same more or less, lying and being in the aforesaid coun-  
ty of Prince Anne, being part of that tract of Land whereon the afo-  
resaid M<sup>rs</sup> Margaret Robinson now lives it being a point of Land on the  
Eastly part of that tract which is partly surrounded by the Fresh  
Dunds and adjoining on one part the lands of M<sup>rs</sup> M<sup>rs</sup> Simmonds and  
divided from his other lands by a line of marked trees according to agreement
