This Indenture made the tenth day of November in the  
year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and one Between  
Thomas Willoughby of the County of Norfolk and Commonwealth  
of Virginia of the one part, and Caleb Boush of the County of Prince  
Anne and Commonwealth aforesaid of the other part, Whereas  
Thomas Matthe lately deceased made and published his last Will and  
testament in writing which is duly proved and recorded in the Court  
of the said County of Prince Anne and therein devised amongst  
other things all his lands at the Bay side to be equally divided between  
his three nephews, the said Thomas Willoughby, Wright Merrell and  
John Murdaugh, after the decease of his Sisters Margaret Hamilton and  
Anne Ramsay, which said Lands were devised to the said Thomas  
Matthe by his half brother John Thorogood deceased, as will also appear by the  
records of the said County of Prince Anne reference being thereto had.  
And Whereas the said Thomas Matthe notwithstanding the word  
heirs being omitted in his said Will must have intended his said  
Nephews a full simple Estate in the revision of the lands devised to  
them, it not appearing by any subsequent clause or devise in the same  
that he intended them a lesser Estate, And Whereas the said Thomas  
Willoughby being desirous of selling and conveying to the said Caleb Boush  
and his heirs forever his third part of the revision of the lands and  
tenements lying and being at the Bayside devised to him as aforesaid  
Now this Indenture witnesseth, that the said Thomas Willoughby  
granted in consideration of the sum of Ninety pounds current money  
to him in hand paid by the said Caleb Boush at or before the sealing  
and delivery of these presents the receipt hereon written he doth hereby  
acknowledge to the said Thomas Willoughby hath Granted Bargained  
sold alined released and confirmed and by these presents doth Grant,
