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This Indenture made the 7<sup>th</sup> day of April in the year of  
our Lord one thousand eight hundred and one Between Eliza Mason  
of the County of Currituck & State of N<sup>o</sup> Carolina of the one part &

other part Witnesseth that for and in consideration of the sum of  
four pounds ten shillings in Specie to the s<sup>r</sup> Eliza Mason in hand  
by the said Thomas Campbell at or before the sealing and delivery of these  
presentments the receipt whereof by the said Eliza Mason have granted bargained  
and sold I confirm by these presents Grant bargain and confirm  
unto the said Thomas Campbell his heirs a tract or parcel of Land cont-  
aining two acres two thirds to the same more or less being all the right that  
I have by the death of Jonathan Mason beginning at a Chinkapin acorn  
tree in the said Campbells line running eastwardly to a pine acorn tree  
in Jacob Chappells line running <sup>North</sup> 30° yards running from thence westwardly to  
John Jamises line running westwardly down the said John Jamises line until it  
interscets the first station of all houses buildings orchards ways water cor-  
ries profits & appurtenances whatsoever to the said premises belonging  
or in any wise appertaining to the revision & revisions remainder remain-  
der units of said profits & all Estate right & title of him the said  
Eliza Mason of & to the same to have and to hold all & singular the  
premises hereby bargained & sold with the appurtenances unto the s<sup>r</sup> Thomas  
Campbell his heirs & assigns forever to the only use & behoof of him the s<sup>r</sup>  
Thomas Campbell for ever free & clear of & from all debts & all other encumbrances
