release, acquit, and discharge the said Edward Valentine his heirs, Executors
and Administrators by these presents, they the said Anne Singleton, Margaret
Wickhart, Isaac Singleton and Elizabeth his wife, Simon Hancock and
Susanna his wife, do grant, bargain and sell, and by these presents have
granted, bargained, sold and delivered, unto the said Edward Valentine and
his heirs forever, all their joint and several right or rights, title or title to
the following Tracts of Land bequeathed unto the said Arthur Sayer
Singleton by the Will of his father Peter Singleton bearing date the
day of duly proved and recorded in the Court of the said County of
Prince Anne, to wit, one hundred and twenty seven Acres Land, lying
near the cross roads bought by the said Peter Singleton of William Kelang's
Executors, all the Land at the cross roads bought by the said Peter Singleton
of Col. Edward Hack Mosely and John Absalom, fifteen and three
quarter Acres Land bought by the said Peter Singleton of Joshua Whitcomb
and fifty acres bought by the said Peter Singleton of Samuel Fentress,
adjoining the land bought of Kelang's Executors thirty Acres up to
