hereby acknowledged, have granted, bargained, sold, aliened, enfeoffed, released  
and confirmed, and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell, alien, enfeoff,  
release and confirm unto the said John Taylor his heirs and Assigns forever,  
a certain Tract or parcel of land situate, lying and being in the County aforesaid  
and bounded as follows to wit: Beginning at the causeway on the eastward side of the bridge next the beach Spring in the road leading to Norfolk  
and thence running along the Meanders of the Branch the line with William  
Hancock the various Courses thereof to the roads leading to Newtown and  
the Bayside, thence along the road to the cross roads leading to Newtown  
Kempville and Norfolk, thence along the Norfolk Road to the beginning  
containing Thirty three Acres, one rod and thirty four pole more or  
less and all Houses, buildings, orchards, ways, waters water, courses,  
profits, commodities and appurtenances, also the revision and reversion  
remainder and remainders, rents, Issues and Profits thereof, and also  
all the Estate, right, title and Interest of them the said John Hancock  
senr, & Susannah his wife of in and to the same, To have and to hold  
the tract or parcel of land situate as aforesaid with its appurtenances  
unto the said John Taylor his heirs and Assigns forever, and the said John  
Hancock senr, & Susannah his wife their heirs, executors and Administrators,  
both concurrent, promise and agree to and with the said John Taylor  
his heirs and Assigns, that they the said John Hancock senr, & Susannah  
his wife and their heirs the said Tract or parcel of Land with its appurtenances

This Indenture made the second day of September in the  
Year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and one Between, John  
Hancock senr, & Susannah his wife of the County of Prince's Anne in the  
Commonwealth of Virginia of the one part, and John Taylor of the Borough  
of Norfolk and Commonwealth aforesaid of the other part, Witnesseth  
that the said John Hancock senr, & Susannah his wife for and in consideration  
of the sum of Twenty pounds five shillings & current money of  
the Commonwealth aforesaid, to them in hand paid by the said John Taylor
