This Indenture Tripartite made the twentieth
day of May in the Year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and
Ninety four, Between Gideon Williamson of the County of Prince Anne
and Commonwealth of Virginia of the first part Nancy Williamson
wife of the said Gideon of the second part, and Mary Dudley mother of
the said Nancy Williamson as her friend and Trustee of the same County and
Commonwealth aforesaid of the third part, Whereas some unhappy differences
have lately happened and still subsist between the said Gideon Williamson
and Nancy his wife, in consequence of which they have agreed, and by the present
do mutually agree, consent and stipulate with each other henceforth to live apart
and apart and previous to such separation he the said Gideon Williamson
hath stipulated and agreed to aid with his wife, and also to and with the
said Mary Dudley as her friend and Trustee to yield up and release all
his right and title to whatever Estate right or interest she the said Nancy William-
son had or claimed to any property either Real or Personal, on the day of her
intermarriage with him, to be possessed of, and to enjoy the same, in such man-
ner as if the said Marriage had never taken place or been solemnized between
them, the said Mary Dudley as friend and Trustee aforesaid having paid
him the sum of thirty pounds in consideration thereof, Now this Indenture
witnesseth that the said Gideon Williamson in conformity to his said
agreement and in order to insure future peace and tranquillity between himself
and his wife, doth hereby for himself his heirs, Executors and Administrators—
covenant promise and agree to and with the said Mary Dudley as friend and
Trustee aforesaid his Heirs Executors and Administrators for and in behalf of his said Wife
