business as she shall hereafter think proper, in the same manner as if she was  
a single woman and unmarried, and that he the said Gideon Williamson, will  
not at any time hereafter sue her or any other person or persons in any court,  
for or on account of her living separate and apart from him, nor will he compel  
her to inhabit with him, nor will he sue or distress any person or persons for receiving  
or entertaining his said wife and that he will not hereafter at any time claim  
or demand any right or title to any species of property which did belong to his  
said wife before her intermarriage with him, and to which he became intituled  
by virtue of such intermarriage, nor to any property which she may in future  
acquire, and that she may at all times sell and dispose of them as aforesaid,  
In Consideration whereof the the said Nancy Williamson doth hereby  
agree to take and accept of the same in full satisfaction of her support and main  
tenance and in full of her Dower, and all other claims, which she might have  
been intituled to from him by virtue of such intermarriage, and the said Mary Dudley  
as friend and Trustee for the said Nancy Williamson, on her behalf and also  
the more perfectly to insure the validity of these presents doth for her self her  
heirs executors and administrators, covenant promise and agree to and with the said Gideon  
Williamson his heirs executors and administrators, that she the said Nancy Williamson shall

not claim or demand from him the said Gideon Williamson his heirs executors  
and administrators any other or further sum or sums, or other things which she might  
or could have claimed from him by virtue of such intermarriage and lastly  
the parties hereto in pursuance to the articles and stipulations herein mentioned  
and in order to profit them have hereunto subscribed the same, and the said  
Gideon Williamson and Mary Dudley have each bound themselves their  
heirs executors and administrators to the other and his or her heirs executors and administrators  
under the penalty of five hundred pounds, that every thing herein contained  
shall be duly observed, and fulfilled, In witness whereof the said three
