tion of the sum of ten Shillings to me in hand paid by my son in law Mr John
Stoue, at or before the sealing and delivery of these presents, the receipt whereof
I do hereby acknowledge have given granted and delivered and by these presents
do give grant and deliver unto the said John Stoue, and to his heirs forever the
following Negre Slaves, to wit, Bridget, Joe, Pleasant, Rachel, Mary, Bridget,
Angie, Sam, Ned, and Owen, To have and to hold the said Slaves
with all the future issue or increase of the Finales of them unto the said John
Stoue and to his heirs forever, In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my
hand and Seal this twentyeth day of November in the year of our Lord one
thousand eight hundred and one and of the Commonwealth the twenty
signed sealed and delivered }

This Indenture made this sixteenth day of February, in
the year of Christ one thousand eight hundred & two, Between
Christopher Inaile & Anne his wife of Princeps Anne County, of the
one part, and Joseph Williamson of the said County, of the other part,
Witnesseth that for & in Consideration of the sum of three hundred
& twenty pounds, now shillings, current money of Virginia to the said Chris-
topher Inaile in hand paid, the receipt whereof he doth hereby acknowledge,
they the said Christopher Inaile & Anne his wife have granted, sold, aliened
confermed unto the said Joseph Williamson this heirs, all that tract of
Land which Peter Whitehurst formerly owned, & being sold by virtue of the
last will of the said Peter Whitehurst did, was purchased by the said Christopher
Inaile, containing by Estimation twenty Acres, be the same more or less, lying
in the said County of Princeps Anne, except the Grave Yard, being thirty feet
square, now bought by the said Ch^r Inaile, & bounded by the lands of Anthony
Walke, and Nathaniel Madenahan, contiguous to the main Road leading
from Kempsville to the Ferry Point; with all the Appurtenances whatsoever,
and all the Estate, title, & Interest of them the said Christopher Inaile &
Anne his wife, To have & to hold the Land hereby conveyed, with
all the appurtenances, unto the said Joseph Williamson, his heirs & assigns,
to the only proper use & behoof of him, & of his heirs & assigns for ever,
and that the said Christopher Inaile and Anne his wife & their heirs the
promises hereby conveyed, with the appurtenances, unto the said Joseph Will-
iamson, his heirs & assigns, against all persons will Warrant & forever
