This Indenture made this sixteenth day of February, in
the year of Christ one thousand eight hundred & two Between
Christopher Snail & Anne his wife of Prince Anne County, of the
one part, and Joseph Williamson of the said County of the other part,
Witnesseth that for & in Consideration of the sum of three hundred
& twenty pounds, six shillings, current money of Virginia to the said Christopher
Snail in hand paid, the receipt whereof he doth hereby acknowledge,
that the said Christopher Snail & Anne his wife have granted, sold, aliened
conveyed unto the said Joseph Williamson this tract, all that tract of
Land which Peter Whitehurst formerly owned, being sold by virtue of the
last will of the said Peter Whitehurst deceased, was purchased by the said Christopher
Snail, containing by Estimation seventy Acres, & the same more or less, lying
in the said County of Prince Anne, saving the Grave Yard, being thirty feet
square, never bought by the said Ch^r Snail bounded by the lands of Anthony
Walke, and Nathaniel MacLuanan, contiguous to the main Road leading
from Kempville to the Ferry Point; with all the appurtenances whatsoever,
and all the Estate, title, & Interest of thim the said Christopher Snail &
Anne his wife, To have & to hold the Land hereby conveyed, with
all the appurtenances, unto the said Joseph Williamson, his heirs & assigns,
to the only proper use & behoof of him, & of his Heirs, & Assigns forever,
and that the said Christopher Snail and Anne his wife & their heirs the
principals hereby conveyed, with the appurtenances, unto the said Joseph Willi
amson, his heirs, & assigns, against all persons will Warrant forever
