the County of Prince Anne and State of Virginia, send Greeting know
ye that I Joshua Lawrence as well for and in consideration of the natural
love and affection which I bear unto my well beloved sons Joseph Lawrence
Timothy Lawrence and Joshua Lawrence each of the County aforesaid also
for divers other good Causes and considerations unto me unto moving that I give
and grant and by these presents I do give and grant, alio and conform
unto my aforesaid sons Joseph, Timothy and Joshua Lawrence a certain
tract or parcel of land lying in the County of Westmoreland in the State
of Pennsylvania in the third District of donation Lands, Beginning
at a Survey tree the numbered corner and running South by Lott No 173

one hundred and sixty perches to a post and white Oak thence East
by Lott No 1737 two hundred and twelve perches to a chestnut, thence with
by vacant Lands one hundred and sixty perches to a Maple, thence west
by lott No 1 Land two hundred and twelve perches to the place of beginning
containing two hundred acres, being the same land that I bought of
Henry Salmons which was granted to said Salmons by the Commonwealth
for his services in the Army of the United States, to be equally divided among
one hundred and sixty perches to each of my sons Joseph, Timothy and
Joshua Lawrence in quantity and quality as near as can be, To have and to hold the aforesaid tract or parcel of
Land with all its appurtenances thence belonging or in any wise appur-
tenant to them said Joseph, Timothy and Joshua Lawrence and their heirs
forever, and I said Joshua Lawrence for myself and my heirs do warrant
and for ever assign the aforesaid tract or parcel of Land to the said Joseph
Timothy and Joshua Lawrence their Heirs and Assigns forever; against
me and my heirs and all and every person or persons whatsoever, from any
claim or demand and from all decree wright and title of decree judgments
and encumbrances whatsoever. In Witness whereof I the said Joshua Lawrence
do execute set my hands and seal this 5th day of April 1802.
