

This Indenture made this third day of April in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and two Between James Gasking and Nanny his wife of the County of Prince Anne and Commonwealth of Virginia of the one part, and William Shephard son of William Shephard dec^d, of the same place of the other part Witnesseth that the said James Gasking and Nanny his wife for and in consideration of the sum of five hundred and thirty three dollars and one third of a dollar to them in hand paid the receipt whereof they do hereby acknowledge have Bargained sold and delivered^{ed}, and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell, alien, and confirm unto the aforesaid William Shephard, a certain parcel, or tract of Land, lying and being in the aforesaid County of Prince Anne, it being a part of the plantation formerly belonging to William Shephard dec^d, it being all the proportionable dividend right and title of the aforesaid plantation which fell to the aforesaid Nanny Gasking by Her ship as divided by the Commissioners by Order of Court appointed, Bounded as follows, viz, on the plantation of Capt. John James, on the one side, and that of Peggy Shepherd daughter of William Shephard dec^d, on the other, with all the tenements and appurtenances unto the same belonging To have and hold the said Land tenements and appurtenances unto the same belonging unto the said William Shephard Jun^r, son of William Shephard dec^d, and to his heirs and Assigns forever, to take and possess, enjoy and to enter upon the said Land free and clear from all debts and incumbrances of what nature or kind soever and the said James Gasking and Nanny his wife their and each of their heirs and Assigns, do hereby agree to Warrant and for ever defend the

right of the aforesaid bargained premises, unto the aforesaid William Shephard and to his heirs and Assigns, forever against any claims debts or demands from any person or persons whatever In Witness where the aforesaid James Gasking and Nanny his wife have hereunto set our hands and seals the day and year first above written.

Lovett and William Haynes Overseers of the poor for the Parish of Lynnhaven in the County of Prince Anne of the one part; and John Forrest Jun^r, an Infant under the age of twenty one years Orphan of John Forrest Sen, late of said County deceased of the other part, Whereas the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Virginia by an act passed the twenty fifth day of November in the year Seventeen hundred and eighty nine entitled "An Act for selling certain Lands in the County of Prince Anne" did authorize and empower the Overseers of the Poor of the said Parish of Lynnhaven to
