sell and dispose of all that tract or parcel of Land with its Appurtenances
commonly called the Parish Land situate lying and being in the aforesaid
County at or near a place called London Bridge containing forty five
acres more or less, for certain purposes therin mentioned, And whereas
the overseers of the Poor of said Parish by virtue of the aforesaid Act of
Assembly did appoint Frederick Brush, John Lovett jun, and Mitchell
Thorogood then of their own Body as Commissioners to sell the aforesaid
land and premises at public Auction, who accordingly exposed the same
to sale in the Year Seventeen hundred and Ninety one Credit of twelve mon-
ths, when the said John Forrest jun deceased became the highest bidder,
and purchased at the price of sixty two pounds six shillings, which sum
with the Interest thereon hath since been fully paid by John Phillips Kidder
Executor of the said John Forrest jun, deceased to the said Overseers of the poor,
And Whereas the said John Forrest jun, departed this life before he had
obtained a Deed of conveyance for said Land, having first made and
published his will and Testament in writing in which he gave and devised
the said Land with its appurtenances unto his son the said John Forrest jun,
with certain Conditions annexed to said devise, as by reference to his Will
duly proved and recorded in the Court of said County will more fully appear
and Whereas the Overseers of the poor of said Parish have lately authorised
and impowered the said John Ansell, John S Lovett and William Haynes
then of their own Body to convey the said Land by deed in pursuant to the
power intitled thereto under the Will of the said John Forrest deceased, do
this Indenture witnesseth that the said John Ansell, John S Lovett and
William Haynes as Overseers of the poor of the s^r Parish of Lykhaven for and

in consideration of the premises, and also for and in the further consideration
of the sum of one dollar to them in hand paid by the said John Forrest jun, at
and before the sealing and delivery of these presents, the receipt whereof is hereby
acknowledged, And by Virtue of the aforesaid Act of Assembly, and of the powers
vested in them at a meeting of the said Overseers of the poor on the seventh day
of November last, and also in pursuance of the Will of the s^r John Forrest jun,
deceased; Have granted, bargained, sold aliened exchanged, released and confirmed
and by these presents do grant, bargaine, sell, alien enfeoff, release and confirm
unto the said John Forrest jun, his heirs and assigns forever the aforesaid tract
or parcel of land with its appurtenances situate, lying and being in the said parish
of Lykhaven and County of Prince Anne containing forty five Acres to the same
more or less, according to the amount known and upped bounds thereof; To have
and to hold the said tract or parcel of land with its appurtenances situate as
aforesaid unto the said John Forrest jun, his heirs and assigns forever, subject
to the conditions and restrictions annexed to the devise of the same in the will
of his said Father; to the only proper use and benefit of him the said John Forrest
jun, and of his heirs and assigns forever, subject as aforesaid to the conditions
and restrictions mentioned in the will of his said Father, In Witness
whereof the said John Ansell, John S Lovett, and William Haynes as Exec-
utors of the poor of the s^r Parish of Lykhaven have hereunto set their hands
and seals the day and year first herein written
