A List of the Names of the Negroes belonging to the Estate of Henry Haynes deceased, this day allotted to, and divided between and among Mr. Betty Haynes, Mr. James Haynes and Elizabeth his wife in right of s. Elizabeth and Mr. Francis Moore and Mary his wife in right of s. Mary, to wit, Ann, Frank, Jonas, Toms, George, Sam, Sam, Cuffy Philip, Peg Jun, Rachel, Abby, Fanny, Jenny, Curious and Peg Jun. &c. the Subscribers being mutually chosen to set apart to Betty Haynes widow of Henry Haynes dec'd, one third of the above Slaves to be held by her during her life, to James Haynes & Elizabeth his wife in right of the s. Elizabeth under the Will of her father her part or proportion of the aforesaid, and to divide the parts to which Francis Haynes & Henry Haynes children of the said Henry Haynes dec'd, were intitled under the will of their father, between and among the above named Betty Haynes, James Haynes and Elizabeth his wife in right of the s. Elizabeth, and Francis Moore and Mary his wife in right of this, s. Mary; have allotted and divided them as follows, vizt, to Mr. Betty Haynes to be held for her life, Marion, Peg Jun, Jenny, Toms & George. To James Haynes & Elizabeth his wife, in right under the Will of her father, Jonas, Philip, Peg Jun, and Abby in fee simple, and these following Negroes to which Francis Haynes & Henry Haynes were intitled and which descended to their Mother Betty Haynes their Sister Elizabeth Haynes of the white blood and Mary Moore their Sister of the half blood we have divided into six parts, and have apportioned to Mr. Betty Haynes two fifths to James Haynes & Elizabeth his wife two

fifths, and to Francis Moore & Mary his wife one fifth, the s. Francis & Mary being only intitled to a half Slave. That is to say, Mr. Betty Haynes Frank, Sam Cuffy in fee simple. To James Haynes and Elizabeth his wife Fanny Curious, in fee simple, and to Francis Moore and Mary his wife Rachael & Harry in fee simple, which said allotments & divisions we have made from a fair and impartial valuation of the s. Negroes according to their Ages & Sexes, & Witness our hands this 7th day of November 1802.

An Agreement entered into this seventh day of November in the year of our Lord Eighteen hundred and one, Between Betty Haynes widow of Henry Haynes dec'd, James Haynes for himself and in behalf of his wife Elizabeth And Francis Moore for himself and in behalf of his wife Mary, Whereas the said Henry Haynes by his Will and testament in writing bearing date the tenth day of December in the year seventeen hundred and eighty five, did make the following Gift and devise, to wit, his and bequeath to my beloved Wife Betty Haynes the use of all my Slaves, till my children respectively arrive at the age of twenty one years or are married, at which time such Child shall receive never his equal part of the Slaves, exclusive of one third part which I give to my said

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
