A List of the Names of the Negroes belonging to the Estate of
Henry Kaynes deceased, this day allotted to, and divided between and
among M^{rs} Betty Kaynes, M^r James Kaynes and Elizabeth his wife
in right of J^r Elizabeth and M^r Francis Moore and Mary his wife in
right of J^r Mary, to wit, Aaron, Frank, Jonas, Lewis, George, Sam^l Ham,
Cuffy, Philip, Peg Jun^r, Rachel, Abby, Fanny, Juny, Eunus and
Peg Jun^r, We the Subscribers being mutually chosen to set apart to Betty
Kaynes widow of Henry Kaynes dec^d, our third of the above Slaves to be
held by her during her life, to James Kaynes & Elizabeth his wife in right
of the J^r Elizabeth under the Will of her father her part or proportion of the
residue, and to divide the parts to which Francis Kaynes & Henry Kaynes
Children of the said Henry Kaynes dec^d, were entitled under the will of their
father, between and among the above named Betty Kaynes, James
Kaynes and Elizabeth his wife in right of the J^r Elizabeth, and Francis
Moore and Mary his wife in right of J^r Mary; have allotted and divided
them as follows, Viz^t, to M^{rs} Betty Kaynes to be held for her life, Aaron,
Peg Jun^r, Juny, Lewis & George. to James Kaynes & Elizabeth his wife, in
right under the Will of her father, Jonas, Philip, Peg Jun^r, and Abby
in fee simple, and these following Negroes to which Francis Kaynes &
Henry Kaynes were entitled and which descended to their Mother Betty
Kaynes their Sister Elizabeth Kaynes of the whole blood and Mary Moore
their Sister of the half blood We have divided into five parts, and have ap-
pointed to M^{rs} Betty Kaynes two fifths to James Kaynes & Elizabeth his wife two

fifths, and to Francis Moore & Mary his wife one fifth, the J^r Francis & Mary
being only entitled to a half Share that is to say, M^{rs} Betty Kaynes Frank, Sam^l
& Cuffy in fee simple. To James Kaynes and Elizabeth his wife Fanny,
Eunus, in fee simple, and to Francis Moore and Mary his wife Rachel &
Harry in fee simple, which said allotments & divisions we have made from a
fair and impartial valuation of the J^r Negroes according to their Ages & Sexes.

An Agreement entered into this seventh day of November in the year of
our Lord Eighteen hundred and one, Between Betty Kaynes widow of
Henry Kaynes dec^d, James Kaynes for himself and in behalf of his wife Elizabeth
And Francis Moore for himself and in behalf of his wife Mary, Whereas
the said Henry Kaynes by his Will and testament in writing bearing date the
fourth day of December in the year Seventeen hundred and eighty two, did make
the following gift and devise, to wit, Give and bequeath to my beloved Wife
Betty Kaynes the use of all my Slaves, till my Children respectively arrive at
the age of twenty one years or are married, at which time such Child shall receive
his or her equal part of the Slaves, exclusive of one third part which I give to my said
