This Indenture made the tenth day of February in the year of our Lord Eighteen hundred and two Between James Haynes of the County of Princeps Anne in the Commonwealth of Virginia of the one part, and Betty Haynes widow of Henry Haynes late of said County of Princeps Anne of the other part, Whereas in a division of Negroes under the will of the said Henry Haynes deceased, made on the seventh day of November last between the said James Haynes and Elizabeth his wife, the said Betty Haynes, and ^{James} Moore and Mary his wife a Negro Woman named Unna, as by the Arbitrators appointed for that purpose allotted and set apart to the said James Haynes and Elizabeth his wife in right of the said Elizabeth and a Negro Man named Frank, was allotted and set apart to the said Betty Haynes, as by the report of the said Arbitrators will more fully appear, And Whereas the said James Haynes and Betty Haynes did then agree to make an exchange of said Negroes; that is to say the said James Haynes did agree to give the said Negro Unna to the said Betty Haynes for the said Negro Frank, which was agreed to by the said Betty Haynes and the said exchange was then ratified by a delivery of said Negroes, Now This Indenture Witnesseth that the said James Haynes for and in consideration of the Premises, and also for and in the further consideration of the sum of one dollar to him in hand paid by the said Betty Haynes at and before the sealing and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, hath bargained, exchanged and delivered and by these presents doth bargain, exchange and deliver unto the said Betty Haynes her heirs and assigns forever the said Negro woman Unna with all her future issue or increase, to have and to hold the said

Negro Unice with all his fixture if you or increase unto the said Betty Haynes his heirs and assigns forever; In Consideration whereof, and also of the sum of one dollar to her in hand paid by the said James Haynes at and before the sealing and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged; She the said Betty Haynes hath bargained, exchanged and delivered, and by these presents doth bargain, exchange and deliver unto the said James Haynes his heirs and assigns forever the said Negro Man named Frank, To have and to hold the said Negro Man Frank unto the said James Haynes his heirs and assigns forever, In Witness whereof the said James Haynes and Betty Haynes, have hereunto set their Hands and Seals the day and Year first herein written.
