issue or increase of the said Union unto him my said Grandson William Haynes  
and to his heirs forever, reserving the use, labour and service of them to myself for  
and during my natural life as aforesaid, In witness whereof I have here-  
unto set my hand & Seal this thirteenth day of February in the year of our  
Lord Eighteen hundred and two.
