which I purchased at the sale of the Estate of John Kintner deceased, with all
the future issue or increase of the said Negro Rachel, reserving however the use
labour and service of the said Negro Rachel and her said issue or increase
to myself for and during my natural life, To have and to hold the said
Negro Rachel and her future issue or increase unto my said Granddaughter
Betsey Thoroughgood Moore and to her heirs forever; reserving the use, labour
and service of the said Negro and her issue or increase to myself for and during
my natural life as aforesaid; In Witnesses whereof I have hereunto set my
hand and Seal this fifth day of April in the Year of our Lord Eighteen hundred
and two

of the said Minnie, reserving however the use Labour and service of said Negroes, and
of the issue or increase of the said Minnie to myself for and during my natural life
To have and to hold the said Negroes Minnie, Sam and Cuffy, with the future
issue or increase of the said Minnie unto him my said Grandson William Haynes
and to his heirs forever, reserving the use, labour and service of them to myself for
and during my natural life as aforesaid; In Witnesses whereof I have here-
unto set my hand & Seal this thirteenth day of February in the Year of our
Lord Eighteen hundred and two
