

The Commonwealth of Virginia to Cornelius Calvert & Anthony Walke Gentlemen Greeting; Whereas John Hancock and Susanna his wife by their certain Indenture of Bargain Sale bearing date the 8 day of August 1800 have sold and conveyed to Nathaniel McClenahan the Fee Simple Estate of and in a certain Tract or parcel of Land lying and being in the County of Princeps Anne, being the Land whereon the said Nathaniel McClenahan now lives, and was devised to him by his father William McClenahan dec'd. and whereas the said Susanna Hancock cannot conveniently travel to our Court of our County of Princeps Anne to make acknowledgement of the said Conveyance aforesaid; Therefore we do give unto you, or any two, or more of you power to receive the acknowledgment which the said Susanna Hancock shall be willing to make before you of the conveyance aforesaid contained in the said Indenture which is hitherto annexed; and We do therefore Command you, or any two, or more of you, that you do personally go to the said Susanna Hancock and Examine her privily and apart from her said husband whether she doth the same freely and voluntarily without the persuasions or threats of her said Husband, and whether she is willing the same should be recorded in the Court of the said County of Princeps Anne and when you have received her acknowledgment and examined as aforesaid that you distinctly and fully certify us thereof in our Court of our said County under your Seals sending then and there the said Indenture and this Writ Witness Edw. R. Mosely Clerk of our Court of our said County the 4 day of October 1800 in the 25th Year of the Commonwealth

By Virtue of this Writ to us directed We the Subscribers did personally to the within named Susanna Hancock wife of the within named John Hancock and examined her privily and apart from her said Husband, and before she acknowledged the Indenture hitherto annexed to the within named Nathaniel McClenahan and declared that she executed the same freely and voluntarily without the threats or persuasions of her said Husband, and that she was willing to relinquish all her right or Title of Inheritance that she has or might claim to the Lands and appurtenances in the said

said Indenture, or conveyance mentioned and was willing that the same should be Recorded in the Court of the County of Princeps Anne which Court we do hereby certify under our Seals this 4 day of October 1800

This Deed Indenture made this 3 day of September 1800 Between Sam Jasper of said Sta and County aforesaid Witness to Robert Dudley sen^r of Virginia & County of Currituck Princeps and that he the said Jasper for & in consideration of the sum of Sixty two Shill^{ts} delivered to me in hand paid by the said Dudley the receipt whereof I hereby acknowledge myself therewith satisfy^d; contented and paid by these presents have sold aliened conveyed and conveyed unto the said Dudley this hirs or assigns One certain measuring piece or parcel of Land lying and being on the wash woods to the North and South of Crosses ridge containing Fifty Acres being part of left Land by Thomas Walke deceased to Marguerit Hamilton and Anne Ramsay; To have He hold the above granted premises unto him the said Robert Dudley I the said Jasper do bind me my heirs Executors Adm^{rs} Vassages to warrant and forever defend the right of the said Land according to and by the last Will Testament of the s^d Walke dec^d; free and clear of any incumbrance of any person or persons laying claim or claims thereto In Witness whereof I have set my hand this 3 day September 1800
