This Indenture made the 1st day of December in the year of our
Lord God One thousand Eight hundred Between Tully Mosley and
John Woodhouse of the County of Princeps Anne of the one part and John
Moore son of Isaiah Moore dec^d, of the same place of the other part, Whereas
in a suit in Chancery instituted in the Month of November in the year one
thousand seven hundred Ninety seven, wherein John Moore & Fanny his
wife were Pl^{ts} and Nancy, Sally & Betty Deerys, Infants, Orphans of Richard
Deery, by Simon Shipps appointed Guardian to defend them in this suit, it
was ordered and decreed by the Court that the said Tully Mosley Cornelius
Keely, John Woodhouse & James Keely Jun^r, or any three of them should sell
the lands which the said Richard Deery died possessed of being forty five Acres
more or less lying and being in the County of Princeps Anne bounded as follows
to wit, beginning at a corner pine in Jonathan Bonnys line running nearly
a south course joining James Keath's land & Arbin Lands here thence running
& joining the North Peason from thence bounded by the Peason to the first
station, and divide the money arising from the sale thereof between the Pl^{ts} and
the De^{ft}; the Court enjoining the dividend or each share of each heir or Child
will not exceed one hundred dollars, Now this Indenture Witnesseth
that the said Tully Mosley, Cornelius Keely & John Woodhouse in obedience
to the said Decree of the said Court after publicly advertising the time and
place of the sale of the said Land and did sell the same to John Moore for the
sum of one hundred pounds who was the highest bidder for the same Now
