

This Indenture made the 1<sup>st</sup> day of December in the year of  
Lord God One Thousand Eight hundred Between Tully Moseley and  
John Woodhouse of the County of Prince Anne of the one part and John  
Moore son of Joseph Moore deceased, of the same place of the other part; Whereas  
in a suit in Chancery instituted in the Month of November in the year one  
thousand seven hundred Ninety seven, wherein John Moore & Fanny his  
wife were Plaintiff and Nancy, Sally & Betsy Berry, Infants Orphans of Richard  
Berry by Simon Shipp appointed Guardian to defend them in this suit, it  
was ordered and decreed by the Court that the said Tully Moseley Cornelius  
Henry, John Woodhouse & James Henry Junr, or any three of them should sell  
the lands which the said Richard Berry died possessed of being forty five acres  
more or less lying and being in the County of Prince Anne bounded as follows  
to wit, beginning at a corner pine in Jonathan Bonney's line running nearly  
a south course joining James Heath's land & Rubin Land's line thence running  
& joining the North Person from thence bounded by the Person to the first  
station, and divide the money arising from the sale thereof between the Plaintiff  
and the Defendant, the Court concurring the dividend or each share of each heir or Child  
will not exceed one hundred dollars, Now this Indenture witnesseth  
that the said Tully Moseley, Cornelius Henry & John Woodhouse in obedience  
to the said Court of the said Court after publicly advertising the time and  
place of the sale of the said Land and did sell the same to John Moore for the  
sum of one hundred pounds who was the highest bidder for the same Now

This Indenture witnesseth that for and in consideration of the said  
Hundred pounds to us in hand paid by the said John Moore in obedience  
to the said Court we have granted bargained and sold unto the said John  
Moore his heirs & assigns forever the aforesaid Forty five Acres of land more  
or less with the Appurtenances to the same belonging, To have and to hold  
the aforesaid Land and appurtenances to him the said John Moore his heirs  
& assigns forever, In Witness whereof we have hereunto set our hands seals  
the day & year above mentioned.
