confirmed and by these presents do grant bargain sold aliened and confirmed
unto the said Jonathan Ward his heirs and assigns forever two acres thereof
acres of land lying in the County & Colony aforesaid beginning at a pine tree
North five degrees east six chain & thirteen links to the rods then South
eighty two degrees east along the said road four chain & thirty links then
south four chain & fourteen links to a corner in the field thence to the first
Station
To have and to hold the said two and half acres of land aforesaid lying
and situated as aforesaid to him the said Jonathan Ward his heirs and assigns
to the duly paper use and behoof of him the said Jonathan Ward his heirs and
