 do grant bargain sell alien & confirm unto the said Peter Malbone his heirs and assigns
 an certain tract or parcel of land situate lying being on the said county and bounded
 as follows by beginning at a gum a line two by the paces running N 84 E 184 pole thence
 N 70 E 26 pole thence N 31 W 84 pole thence N 31 W 80 pole thence N 71 W 37 pole at a gum in the
 head of a branch thence down the middle of the same to the paces thence by the mean
 line of the same to the first station contains one hundred & forty Acres To have
 and to hold the said bargained premises with the appurtenances thereunto
 belonging to the said Peter Malbone his heirs Executors or administrators for ever to
 him & their own proper use and behoof & the said Charles W^m Lovey his wife do hereby
 covenant & promise that the said land is free from any incumbrance whatsoever had
 made done committed or suffered by them & they for themselves their heirs executors
 & Administrators the said bargained premises unto the said Peter Malbone his heirs
 and assigns forever with warrant & acquit against all & every person or persons what-
