the said William Morris and Sally his wife in consideration of Five
hundred & Thirty pounds of lawful money of this Commonwealth, to them
in hand paid by the said Jesus Morris at or before the sealing and delivery
of these presents, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have bargained
and sold and by these presents do, and each of them Doth bargain and
sell unto the said Jesus Morris his heirs and assigns a certain Tract of
Land & Marsh containing one hundred and five acres more or less, lying
and being in the County of Prince Anne, Bound by back bay on the
East & North, and adjoining the land of William Dawley on the west,
and the land of the said Jesus Morris on the south, it being known
Ex^r by the old plantation together with all the singular houses barns building
Orchards lands tenements pastures woods ways waters, water courses,
privileges profits commodities, advantages, emoluments, hereditaments
and appurtenances whatsoever to the said Land belonging, or appert-
aining or with the same used or enjoyed, or excepted, or known as part
part or member thereof, and the revision and rversion, remainder
and reversionary and other rents issues and profits thereof and
of way part and parcel thereof, to have and to hold the said
Land & Marsh with the tenements hereditaments and all and singular
