condition that the said Peckworth fixes a Gate at the commencement
of the said lane near the said Hamilton's mansion house, keeps it
constantly in good repair, To have and to hold the said five
acres of land with all the houses standing thereon, & all the appurte-
nances thereto belonging, unto the said William Peckworth
his heirs for and during the term of fifteen years, from and after the
first day of January in the year of our Lord eighteen hundred & six, and
to be completed and ended, on the last day of December, in the year of
our Lord eighteen hundred and twenty, yielding yearly and every
