of one dollar in hand paid by them the receipt whereof I hereby ac
knowledge have Given granted and confirmed, and by these presents do give
grant and confirm unto my said sons Wm Whitchard and John Whitchard
their heirs and assigns forever a certain tract or parcel of Land contain
ing One hundred and thirty two Acres of Land more or less, lying and
being in the County and Commonwealth aforesaid Piney Ridge adjour
ning the lands that was Joe, Nancy & Tully Moore and the land of
Stephen Malone and the land that was Joe Malone and the land

of Ja' Whitchard and to be divided as follows, to wit, beginning at a Gum
in James Whitchards line thence running westwardly by a line of marks
to an Ash standing in the line that was Ja' Malone ad to the
thoward of that line, which said part I Give and confirm unto my said
son John Whitchard and his heirs and assigns forever, To Give & Confirm
the Land to the Southward of the aforesaid line to my said son William
Whitchard and his heirs and assigns forever, To have and to hold
the aforesaid Land unto them my said Sons William Whitchard and
