This Indenture made the tenth day of August in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and two Between John Woodland sen and Dority Woodland his wife and John Woodland Jr and Mary Woodland of the County of Prince Anne and state of Virginia of the one part and Robert Land of the County and State of Virginia aforesaid of the other part, Witnesseth that for and in the consideration of the sum of five hundred and fifty Dollars in hand paid by the said Robert Land to the said John Woodland sen, and Dority his wife and John Woodland Jr and Mary Woodland the receipt whereof they do hereby acknow

This Indenture made this second day of October in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and two Between Jonathan Wright and Betty his wife of the County of Prince Anne and Commonwealth of the one part and Elizabeth Cornick of the same place of the other part, Witnesseth that the said Jonathan Wright and Betty his wife for and in consideration of the sum of three hundred and forty nine pounds ten shillings current money of Virginia to them in hand paid by the the aforesaid Elizabeth Cornick, the receipt whereof they do hereby acknowledge, have bargained sold and delivered and by these presents do grant bargain sell, alien and confirm unto the aforesaid Elizabeth Cornick and to her heirs and assigns forever, one certain parcel or tract of Land lying and being in the aforesaid County and bounded as follows viz Beginning at a large sweet gum, in a run known by the name of Little run, a corner tree, thence running northerly to a thin young gum, thence easterly down the said run to a corner tree, thence running north to a black a corner tree, thence south to a black, a corner tree, thence to the first station, containing in the whole by estimation one hundred and sixteen and a half acres be the same more or less which plantation is known by the name of the Black run, with all the tenements and appurtenances unto the same belonging, to have and to hold the said Lands tenements and appurtenances unto the said Elizabeth Cornick and to her heirs and assigns forever, to take, possess, enjoy, and to enter upon the said Land free and clear from all dowers and incumbrances of what nature or kind soever and the said Jonathan Wright and Betty his wife for themselves, their and each of their heirs and assigns do hereby agree to warrant and forever defend the right of the aforesaid
