This Indenture made this second day of October in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and two Between Robin Land and Lydia his wife of the County of Prince Anne in Virginia of the one part and Richard Stone of the same place of the other part Witnesses that they the said Robin Land and Lydia his wife for and in consideration of the sum of Sixty pounds lawful money of Virginia to him in hand paid by the said Richard Stone before the sealing and delivery these presents the receipt whereof written they do hereby acknowledge they the said Robin Land and Lydia his wife have granted bargained sold and by these presents do grant bargain sell and confirm unto the said Richard Stone his heirs and assigns for ever Thirty five and a quarter and half quarter acres of land lying and being in the aforesaid and bounded as follows Beginning at a Cauphae post in Caleb Land's line in the bypress branch running a cross the old field to a white Gum thence running by marker lines to a black gum in Moses Fentrop's line a corner line thence bending on the said Fentrop's line till it comes to the line of Thomas Kewdel's line thence running down a line fence that stands between Thomas Kewdel's line and the said land to the bypress branch thence running down the run and bending on Caleb Land's to the first Cauphae post together with all Houses buildings orchards woods waters water courses whatsoever to the said premises belonging or in any wise appertaining and the reversion and reversions remainder and remainders rents issues and profits thereof and all the rights and titles of them the said Robin Land and Lydia his wife of in or to the same, To have and to hold the said Land

and appertinances unto the said Richard Stone his heirs and assigns forever free and clear from Dowers and all other incumbrances of what nature and kind soever and the said Robin Land and Lydia his wife and their heirs all and singular the premises hereby bargained and sold with the appertinances unto the said Richard Stone his heirs and assigns against them the said Robin Land and Lydia his wife and their heirs and assigns against them the said Robin Land and Lydia his wife and their heirs shall and will Warrant and for ever defend by these presents In Witness whereof they the said Robin Land and Lydia his wife have hereunto set their hands and Seals and Seals the day and Year first above mentioned
