Witnesseth that for and in consideration of the sum of five pounds lawful
money of Virginia in hand paid, to the said Charles Bradley, by the said William
Searcy at or before the sealing and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof
he doth hereby acknowledge he the said Charles Bradley have granted bargained
and sold and confirmed and by these presents have granted bargained and
sold unto the said William Searcy and his heirs one certain tract or parcel of land
containing three four Acres be the same more or less lying and being in the County
of Prince Anne near the province line and bounded by the following courses
that is to say Beginning at a corner holly standing in the line of Co^s Josiah
Patterson, and running southerly along a line to a brack from thence turning
westerly to a brack standing in the Merchants line thence southerly along the
said Merchants line to a white Oak thence easterly down Co^s Josiah Patterson
line to the first stationer holly and all Houses building ways waters water
courses profits and appurtenances whatsoever to the said premises belonging or in any
wise appertaining and the reversion and reversions remainder and remainders
