This Indenture made the second day of January in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and two Between Mary Ewell of the County of Princeps Anne on the Commonwealth of Virginia of the one part, and Edward Widgeon J^r of the Borough of Norfolk and Commonwealth aforesaid of the other part, Witnesseth that the said Mary Ewell for and in consideration of the sum of two hundred dollars current money of the Commonwealth aforesaid, to her in hand paid by the said Edward Widgeon J^r at or before the sealing and delivery of these presents, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have granted, bargained, sold

aliened, enfeoffed, released and confirmed, and by these presents do grant bargain, sell, alien, enfeoff, release and confirm unto the said Edward Widgeon J^r his heirs and assigns for ever, a certain tract or parcel of Land situate, lying and being in the County of Princeps Anne and bounded as follows to wit; Beginning at a sown wood in Lot. Edw. H. Mosley's line, (which is a corner of Janet Ewells land) and running and binding on the same six chain and forty links to a maple corner of John Ewells land, thence binding on John Ewells line N²⁸ E to the Mill run, thence easterly binding on the run to Janet Ewells line, thence S⁷⁷ W to the sown wood the first station in Lot. Edw. H. Mosley's line containing twenty four Acres, more or less and twenty seven pole more or less and the same which was allotted the said Mary Ewell in a division of the lands of which John Chapman died seized and possessed as will appear by referring to the records of Princeps Anne County Court, and all houses, buildings, orchards, ways, waters, woods, courses profits, commodities and appurtenances, also the reversion and remainders, remainder and remainders, rents, Issues and profits thereof, and also all the estate, right, title and interest of her the said Mary Ewell of, in and to the same, To have and to hold the said tract or parcel of land situate as aforesaid with its appurtenances unto the said Edw. Widgeon J^r his heirs and assigns for ever to the only proper use and behoof of him the said Edward Widgeon J^r and of his heirs and assigns for ever, and the said Mary Ewell for herself her heirs, Executors and administrators, doth covenant, promise and agree to and with the said Edw.
