Sen. and James Taylor Sen. Administrators of the Estate of Colonel Robert
Tucker deceased in the sum of Four hundred and sixty five pounds eight
shillings and eight pence current money of Virginia did by Deed bearing
date the thirtieth day of August in the Year one thousand seven hundred and
Ninety eight convey to James Taylor Jun. in Trust for the said Thomas Newton
sen. and James Taylor sen. Two Tracts of Land situate lying and being in the
County of Prince Anne, and one in the County of Norfolk as by said Deed
duly proved and recorded in the Courts of the said Counties of Prince Anne
