& Blanny his wife in hand paid by the said John Hopkins at or before the said
and delivering of these presents the receipt whereof written they do hereby acknowledge
and thereof doth release acquit and discharge the said John Hopkins his heirs
and Administrators by these presents they the said William Hunter and Blanny
his wife have granted bargained sold alien and confirmed and by these presents
doth grant bargain sell alien and confirm unto the said John Hopkins and
his heirs for ever one certain tract or parcel of land situate lying and being in
the County of Prince Anne containing Forty Acres be the same more or less
bounded as followeth Beginning at Peter Whitehurst's line and running along
his line down to John Hopkins line thence along his line down to John Hunter line
thence along his line to Peter Whitehurst's line to its first beginning and all houses
building orchards ways waters water courses profits commodities hereditaments and
appurtenances whatever to the said premises hereby granted or any part thereof
belonging or in any wise appertaining and the revision and revisions remain
and remainders unto issues and profits thereof and also all the estate right till
interest use trust property claim and demand whatsoever of the said William
