

This Indenture made the sixth day of December in the
Year of Christ, eighteen hundred and two Between John Dyer and
Lucy his wife of the County of Prince Anne and Commonwealth of Virginia
of the one part and John Rainey of the same place of the other part, Witnesseth
that the said John Dyer and Lucy his wife for and in consideration of the sum
of One hundred and twenty five pounds current money of Virginia in hand paid
by him, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged by the said John Dyer and
Lucy his wife, have granted, bargained, sold and confirmed and by these presents,
do grant, bargain, sell and confirm unto the said John Rainey his heirs and
assigns for ever Twenty three acres of land more or less, situated lying and being
in the said County of Prince Anne and bounded as follows, to wit, on the South
and North by the land of Elizabeth Denney, and on the East and West by the
lands of the said Dyer and Rainey, with all and singular its appurtenances
unto him the said John Rainey his heirs & assigns forever. To have and to hold
to him the said John Rainey his heirs and assigns forever the aforesaid twenty three
acres of land more or less with its appurtenances thence belonging to him the said
John Rainey his heirs and assigns forever to the only proper use and behoof of him
the said John Rainey his heirs and assigns forever; and the said John Dyer and
Lucy his wife and their heirs do warrant and forswear before these presents the
said land and premises unto him the said John Rainey his heirs and assigns
to be free and clear of and from all incumbrances of what nature and kind soever
in witness whereof the said John Dyer and Lucy his wife have hereunto set
their hands and seals the day and year first herein written

& Susannah his wife of the County of Prince Anne in the Commonwealth
of Virginia of the one part, and Simon Hancock of the County and Common-
wealth aforesaid of the other part, Witnesseth that the said John Hancock
& Susannah his wife for and in consideration of the sum of one hundred and
six dollars current money of the Commonwealth aforesaid, to him in hand paid
by the said Simon Hancock at or before the sealing and delivery of these presents
the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have granted, bargained, sold, aliened,
excluded, released and confirmed, and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell, also
convey, release and confirm unto the said Simon Hancock his heirs and assigns
forever, a certain tract or parcel of Land situate lying and being in the County of
Charles Anne and bounded as follows to wit, Beginning at a stony rock with
Oak standing by the road leading to the bay side a corner of the said Simon Han-
cock's land thence binding on the same north two degrees west thirteen chain and
seventy links North thirty degrees east two chain and seventy links to an Oak,
North thirty five and a half degrees east four chain and forty links to a buck,
north forty degrees west one chain and fifty links to a white Gum a corner in
Richard H. L. Lawson line, thence binding on his line of marked trees south west
two degrees east one chain & fifty links to an Oak, south sixty nine degrees east one
chain to a maple, south seventy five and an half degrees east two chain to an
Oak by the bay side road, thence binding on a twenty feet road which separates
this land from the said Lawsons & Mary Hoggards left by the said John Hancock
