This Indenture made the twenty ninth day of October in the year
of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and two Between John Hancock
and Susannah his wife of the County of Prince Anne in the Commonwealth
of Virginia of the one part, and Simon Hancock of the County and Common-
wealth aforesaid of the other part, Wiltnefeth that the said John Hancock
and Susannah his wife for and in consideration of the sum of one hundred and
six dollars current money of the Commonwealth aforesaid, to them in hand paid
by the said Simon Hancock at or before the sealing and delivery of these present
the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have granted, bargained, sold, aliened,
enfeoffed, released and confirmed, and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell, also
enfeoff, release and confirm unto the said Simon Hancock his heirs and assigns
forever, a certain tract or parcel of Land situate lying and being in the County of
Prince Anne and bounded as follows to wit: Beginning at a stepping white
Oak standing by the road leading to the bay side a corner of the said Simon Hancock's
land thence binding on the same north two degrees west thirteen chain and
seventy links North thirty degrees east two chain and seventy links to an Oak,
South thirty five and a half degrees east four chain and fifty links to a birch,
north forty degrees west one chain and forty links to a white Gum a corner in
Richard H. S. Lawson's line thence binding on his line of marked trees south west
two degrees east one chain forty links to an Oak, south sixty nine degrees east
chain to a maple, south seventy five and an half degrees east two chain to an
Oak by the bay side road, thence binding on a twenty feet road which separates
this land from the said Lawsons & May Roggards left by the said John Hancock

for the convenience of conveying his timber from his back land to the aforesaid
road (leading to the Bay side) 8 chain & 60 links, thence S 18° W winding on it
in Hancock to David Patterson's line, thence on S. Patterson to the Bayside
road, thence on S. road to the beginning containing 25 Acres 20 pole more or less
and all houses, buildings, orchards, ways, waters, water courses, profits, communi-
ties and appurtenances, also the reversion and reversions, remainders and
remainders, rents, issues and profits thereof, and also all the estate right, title
and interest of them the said John Hancock and Susannah his wife of, in

person and persons whatsoever, shall and will warrant and for ever defend by these
