

This Indenture made the sixth day of September One thousand Eight hundred in the Year of Lord, Between John Thorowgood Sen^r, of the County of Princeps Anne and State Virginia of the one part and Adam Thorowgood of the same place of the other part, Witnesseth that for and in consideration of the Natural love and affection which I bear my Son the said Adam Thorowgood, and for other considerations not hereunto moving, hath bargained sold, aliened given and confirmed, and by these presents doth bargain and sell, alien, give and confirm unto the said Adam Thorowgood his heirs and Assigns forever, a certain Tract or parcel of Land containing Eighty seven and a quarter Acres of Land, Beginning at Salmon's bridge and running south 7 degrees East, 20 poles, South 27 degrees East 33 poles, south 5 1/2 degrees east 38 poles south 3 1/2 degrees East 18 poles south 16 degrees west 41 pole, south 2 1/2 degrees west 34 poles south 14 degrees East 26 poles south 34 degrees East 10 poles along the north Landing road to William Robinson's Land thence round the said Robinson's land to the said North Landing road thence south 40 degrees east 24 poles to the horse bridge over thence binding on the Land formerly Samuel Fentress by a line of marked trees to a sweet Gum by the swamp side, thence west 14 1/2 poles to a corner Cypress in the swamp, thence along a line of marked trees to a stake in the swamp, thence North 21 1/2 degrees eastwardly 16 poles north 14 degrees Easterly 18 poles north 6 1/2 degrees eastwardly 19 poles north 19 degrees Easterly 14 poles north 14 degrees eastwardly 10 poles to the first situation the said Land situated lying and being in the aforesaid County the said Land being formerly George Jamison deceased, it being the Land I bought of said Jamison and all Houses and buildings, Orchards, Ways watercourses profits appurtenances whatsoever to the said premises belonging or in any way appertaining and the revision and reversion and remainder and remainders issues and rents and profits thereof and all the Estate right Title of him the said John Thorowgood Sen^r, of in and unto the same, To have

and to hold all and singular the premises hereby bargained and sold with the appurtenances unto the said Adam Thorowgood his heirs and Assigns forever, free and clear of all incumbrances of what nature or kind soever unto the said Adam Thorowgood, to the proper use and behoof of him the said Adam Thorowgood, and lastly the said John Thorowgood Sen^r, and his heirs, and all and singular the premises hereby bargained and sold with the appurtenances unto the said Adam Thorowgood his heirs and Assigns against him the said John Thorowgood Sen^r, and his heirs and all and every other person or persons whatsoever, shall and will warrant and forever defend by these presents.
