

This Indenture made October the twenty seventh in the year of our Lord Christ one thousand eight hundred and two, Between William Dawley of the County of Princeps Anne in the Colony of Virginia on the one part and Charles Mollum of the County and Colony aforesaid of the other part Witnesseth that for and in consideration of the sum of fifteen hundred money of Virginia to him in hand paid by the said Charles Mollum at the insuing and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof William Dawley and Anne his wife acknowledgeth, and well paid and paid thereof doth agree release and discharge the said Charles Mollum his heirs executors administrators and assigns forever hath granted bargained sold and confirmed by these presents doth grant bargain sell and confirm unto the said Charles Mollum his heirs and assigns forever one certain tract or parcel of Marsh land lying in the County aforesaid and on the north side of Nanney Creek and bounded as followeth beginning at the said Creek and running north easterly to the back line thence beginning on David Mollus Marsh thence to the said Creek and thence to the first stake for ten acres of marsh land with rents issues and profits thereof and all the right and title interest claim or demand whatsoever of him the said William Dawley and Anne his wife his heirs executors administrators and assigns or of them or of or on the same and well paid and paid thereof with the appurtenances hereby granted or intended to be granted with the said Charles Mollum his heirs executors administrators or assigns to the only proper use and behoof of him the said Charles Mollum his heirs and assigns forever and the said William and Anne his wife for themselves their heirs executors administrators

to and with the John Wright his heirs and assigns that he said John Wright his heirs and assigns shall forever peacefully and quietly hold possess and enjoy the said land with the appurtenances without the molestation or interruption of any person or persons and said William Dawley and Anne his wife his heirs and assigns shall and will at any time or times hereafter make and execute all such other conveyance for the better confirming said land and premises hereby granted with the appurtenances without any manner of let suit trouble or intimation of the said William Dawley and Anne his wife their executors or administrators from any other person or persons whatsoever with warrant and force defend the same In Witness whereof we the said William Dawley and Anne his wife hath hereunto set their hand and seal the day and year first above written
