 part, and Tully Whitehurst of the same County of the other part, Witnesseth
 that for and in consideration of the sum of thirty nine pounds current money
 of Virginia to the said Caleb Williamson and Elizabeth his wife and Anne
 Godfrey in hand paid by the said Tully Whitehurst at or before the sealing
 and delivery of these presents, the receipt hereon written they do hereby acknowledge
 and thereof doth release acquit and discharge the said Tully White-
 hurst, his heirs, Executors administrators, by these presents they the said
 Caleb Williamson and Elizabeth his wife and Anne Godfrey, have granted
 bargained, sold aliened and conveyed, and by these presents doth grant
 bargain sell alien and convey unto the said Tully Whitehurst, and his
 heirs for ever, one certain tract or parcel of Land, situate lying and being
 in the County of Prince Anne, containing Forty three and one quarter be the same
 more or less, and bounded as followeth, beginning at a corner of Ann Whitehurst
 and Thomas Boone and running along Thomas Boone line down to William Vrats
 thence along William Vrats line down to William Whitehurst line thence along Will-
 iam Whitehurst line down to Anne Whitehursts line thence a long Anne Whitehurst
 line to its first station and all houses buildings, outhouses, crops waters water course
 profits commodities hereditaments and appurtenances whatever to the said premises
 hereby granted, or any part thereof belonging, or in any way appertaining, and
