bear to my son Anthony Walke, junior, as well as for the further consideration
of one dollar to me in hand paid by the said Anthony Walke, at or before the
insending & delivery of these presents, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged,
have given & granted, & by these presents do give and grant unto the said Antho-
ny Walke, his Heirs & assigns, part of a tract of Land called Schepis, and
bounded as follows, Beginning at a cedar tree near the main road, running
along a ditch to the woods, & the same course thro' the Woods to the Land
formerly owned by Celia Whitehurst, and on the south bounded by the land of
Mr. Hancock then the west by the main Road, & have & he hold the
said Land with the Tenements, hereditaments, & Appurtenances, unto the said
Anthony Walke my eldest Son, his Heirs & assigns forever, In Witness
whereof I have hereunto set my Hand & Seal this 5th day of February in the
Year of Christ 1803

This Indenture made this sixteenth day of January in the year of our
Lord one thousand eight hundred and two, Between John Stone
of the one part, and Simon Stone of the other, both of the County of Prince
Anne Williamsburgh, That whereas the said John Stone in virtue of his marriage
with Elizabeth Keeling daughter of William Keeling late of Prince Anne afore-
said deceased, is since the decease of the said William Keeling, become entitled
to a part or proportion of the real and personal Estate whereof the said William
Keeling died possessed, and whereas the said John Stone continues to remain
from the State of Virginia, and the said Simon Stone having agreed to purchase
all the right and interest of the said John Stone, in and to the Estate aforesaid
and to enjoy thereof, Now therefore this Indenture further Witnesseth
that the said John Stone for and in consideration of the sum of four
thousand dollars to him in hand paid by the said Simon Stone before the
making and delivery hereof, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, the
said John Stone hath as he doeth by these presents, Warrant, sell, assign,
transfer and set over unto the said Simon Stone, all the Estate right and
title whatsoever property claims & demand whatsoever of him the said John Stone
in and to that part or portion of the estate of the said William Keeling
as well his interest in the land, as his title to the Slaves and other personal
Estate to which he the said John Stone is entitled by virtue of his marriage
said, To have and to hold the same as soon as a division thereof is made,
to the said Simon Stone his Heirs and assigns forever, and the said John
Stone doth hereby covenant promise and agree, and for his Heirs Executors and
Administrators doth covenant promise and agree to and with the said Simon
