ledged, have bargained, sold and delivered, and by these presents do, by my
will and desire unto the said Simon Stone, all the articles hereafter men-
tioned, to wit, Negro woman Bridget, and her son Joe, Pleasant, Rachel
Bridget, Aragyle, Jim, Ned & Owen her four Children and girl Mary, one
Sorrel Horse, one bay horse one old black Mare, eight head of Cattle, two
Hogs and Pigs, one riding Chair and Harness, three saddles, three Beasts of
Burden and their Cutlery and furniture, one side Board, one Sopha,
one Tea table, six windsor Chairs, one Carpet, four sets of Knives and forks
one set of cutlery ware, table Clothies and towels and one set of window cur-
tains, also, all this present year's Crop, both growing and grown, consisting of eleven
Stacks of Oats all the flat, Potatoes, and Corn. To have and to hold the above
bargained premises unto the said Simon Stone, his heirs executors administrators
and assigns forever, and to no other intent or purpose whatsoever. In testimony whereof
I have huncuius set my hand and Seal this twenty sixth day of July in the year of
our Lord, one thousand eight hundred and two.
