part witnesseth that for and in consideration of the sum of one hundred  
and thirty pounds sixteen shillings by the said James Lewis to them in hand  
paid at or before the sealing and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof  
they do hereby acknowledge and thereof release and acquit the said James Lewis

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his heirs executors and administrators have granted sold alien'd transformed  
and for spiced and by these presents do grant bargaine and sale  
transform and resum unto the said James Lewis one certain piece of land  
of Land bounded and being in the County of Prince Anne known by  
the name of Sisbous containing by estimation one hundred and nine acres  
of land to the same more or less Beginning at the river bank in Jameson's  
line running north by a line of marked trees to Davis's line thence running  
easterly along of marked trees a red oak corner tree in the negro swamp,  
thence south westerly by a line of marked trees to a hollow in Jameson's line  
thence along the said line to the station the same to contain one hundred  
and nine acres of land more or less and all profits and all the estate right  
and title and interest of him the said John Johnston and Nancy his wife  
of and in the said premises, to have and to hold the said One hundred  
and nine acres of land more or less to him the said James Lewis and his  
heirs and assigns forever and the said John Johnston and Nancy his wife  
their heirs and the single the premises bargained and sold with the appur-  
tenances and to the said James Lewis his heirs and assigns forever Lastly  
to the said John Johnston and his wife Nancy warrants and defenses  
against themselves and free of claiming any part thereof Mr Wiles  
whereof are the said John Johnston and Nancy his wife have hereunto set  
their hands and paid their seals the day and year above mentioned
