This Indenture made the thirtieth day of November in the Year
of our Lord Eight hundred and two Between Samuel Cornick and
Jed Cornick of the County of Prince Anne in the Commonwealth of Virginia
Commissioners acting under a decree of the worshipful Court of the County of
Prince Anne of the one part; and Thomas Cornick of the County and
Commonwealth aforesaid, of the other part; Whereas in a Suit brought in the
Court of said County by Amy Cornick widow and next of John Cornick
deceased, and John and Mary Hayes Cornick Infants Orphans of the
said John Cornick deceased by the said Amy Cornick their Mother and

Guardians against Joshua James and Francis his wife, and Solomon Steel
and Anne his wife - it was decreed and ordered on the fifth day of October in
the year eighteen hundred and one that Samuel Cornick and Jed Cornick, and the said
Samuel Cornick and Jed Cornick or any two of them should sell at public
auction for ready money after giving public notice of the time and place of
sale certain Lands and Slaves in the said decree particularly named as
hereinafter shall more fully appear, And Whereas the said Samuel
Cornick and Jed Cornick two of the said Commissioners in pursuance to
said decree did on the twenty sixth day of December in the year eighteen
hundred and one expose to sale at public auction for ready money the Lands
and Slaves mentioned in said decree, at which sale the said Thomas Cornick
bought the highest bidder and purchaser of a certain tract of Swamp Land
herein after mentioned at the price of one hundred and twenty three pounds,
Now This Indenture Witnesseth that the said Samuel Cornick and
Jed Cornick as Commissioners aforesaid, and in pursuance to said decree, and
for and in consideration of the said sum of one hundred and twenty three
pounds current money of Virginia to them in hand paid by the said Thomas
Cornick at and before the sealing and delivery of these presents, the receipt
whereof is hereby acknowledged; have granted, bargained and sold, and by these
presents do grant bargain and sell unto the said Thomas Cornick his heirs and
Assigns forever all that tract, piece or parcel of Swamp Land situate, lying
and being in the said County of Prince Anne which John James first acting
Executor of the last Will and testament of Thomas Woodhouse deceased by deed
bearing date the twelfth day of June in the year seventeen hundred and eighty
eight sold and conveyed to the said Jed Cornick containing by estimation
