of the said Commonwealth, Collector of the Taxes in the said County of
Prince Anne for the year 1802 by Commission bearing date the 15th day of
January 1803. It therefore the said William Bishop do and shall truly
and faithfully collect receive account for and pay the public taxes due for
the aforesaid year of 1802 as imposed and directed to be collected by Law
to the person or persons required and empowered by law to receive the same
for the use of the said Commonwealth then the above obligation to be void
or else to remain in full force and virtue.
