Know all Men by these presents that the William Bishop & James  
Robinson of the County of Prince Anne are held and firmly bound to the  
Honourable Tullis Moseley, Abing Rettine, Mr. Lawson & Mr. Woodburn  
Gentlemen Justices of the peace for the County of Prince Anne now setting  
in Two thousand four hundred dollars for payment whereof will and truly to  
be made we bind ourselves and each of us our and each of our heirs executors and  
Administrators jointly and severally firmly by these presents sealed with our Seals  
and dated this 12<sup>th</sup> day of February 1803 in the 25<sup>th</sup> year of the Commonwealth of Virginia.

The Condition of this Obligation is such that whereas the above named  
William Bishop is constituted and appointed collector to collect the County  
Taxe this day laid and imposed on the taxable persons in this County for  
year 1802. Now therefore if the said William Bishop do and shall will and  
truly collect and receive the County Taxe laid and imposed as aforesaid and  
pay the same to the several claimants for whom the same or part thereof  
presented and deducted by law, then the above obligation to be void or its  
termour in full force and vertue.

This Indenture, made the fourth day of April in the year one thousand  
eight hundred and three and in the year of the Commonwealth Between  
Dennis Davy and Elizabeth his wife of the County of Norfolk in the  
State of Virginia, of the one part, and David Methado and Mary Methado  
his mother of the County of Prince Anne in the State aforesaid of the other  
part, witnesseth, that the said Dennis Davy and Elizabeth his wife  
for and in consideration of the sum of sixteen thousand six hundred and  
sixty six dollars &c of lawful money of this Commonwealth, to them in hand  
paid, by the said David Methado and Mary Methado at or before the en-  
suing and delivery of these presents, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged,  
hath bargained and sold, and by these presents doth grant bargain and  
sell unto the said David Methado and Mary Methado their heirs and  
affees, a certain tract of land situate lying and being in the aforesaid  
County of Prince Anne and bounded as follows to wit, Beginning at a  
Stump, in a Marsh, at a corner of the line of the land, late the property  
of the Rev. Robert Dawson died and known running westward, binding on the  
same, on a line of marked trees to Anthony Walker's land, thence bending  
on said Walker to a branch of Lynnhaven river, thence bending on the said  
river, the various courses thereof to the first Station, containing Six Hundred  
Acre, to the same more or less, and is the same land which the said  
Dennis Davy purchased from Wm. White acting Esq. of Henry, William  
did as will appear & record in Court of the County of Prince Anne the  
day bearing date the 26<sup>th</sup> day of March 1790, with the exception of thirty  
per square of land in the old Orchard, for a Gravel yard as is expressed
