for and in Consideration of the sum of Seventy pounds current money  
of Virginia to me in hand paid by John Thoroughgood son, of said County  
and Commonwealth at and before the sealing and delivery of these  
presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged; have bargained,  
sold and delivered, and by these presents do bargain sell and deliver  
unto the said John Thoroughgood, his heirs and assigns forever, four  
Negro Slaves to wit, Amy, Jeffery, young Ned and Kate, To  
have and to hold the said Negroes Amy, Jeffery, young Ned  
and Kate with all the future increase of the females of them unto the  
said John Thoroughgood, his heirs and assigns forever, And I the said  
James Thoroughgood for myself my heirs Executors and Administrators  
do hereby agree to warrant and defend the title of the said Negroes unto  
him the said John Thoroughgood, his heirs, Executors and Administrators  
against the claim of all and every person and persons whatsoever.  
In Witnesses whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this  
third day of June in the Year of our Lord One thousand seven hundred  
and ninety nine

Know all Men by these presents that I John Thoroughgood  
Sen. of the County of Princeps Anne and Commonwealth of Virginia  
for and in Consideration of the natural love and affection which I have  
for my Grand Children, Susannah Wainhouse, James and John Thoro-  
wgood Children of James Thoroughgood and Susannah his wife, and  
for their better promotion and advancement in the World; Have given  
granted and delivered, and by these presents do give grant and deliver  
unto my said three Grand Children, four Negro slaves, which I purchased  
of their Father the said James Thoroughgood, that is to say, I give grant and  
deliver unto my Grand daughter Susannah Wainhouse Thoroughgood and to  
her heirs forever a Negro Girl called Amy; To my Grandson James Thoro-  
wgood two negro Slaves called Jeffery and Kate to him and his heirs; To my  
Grandson John Thoroughgood and to his heirs, a Negro Boy called young Ned  
To have and to hold the said Negroes Amy, Jeffery, young Ned and  
Kate with the future increase of the females of them unto my said Grand  
Children, Susannah Wainhouse, James, and John Thoroughgood and to their heirs  
for ever severally and respectively as herein before given, In Witness whereof  
I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this fifth day of  
January in the Year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and one
