presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged; have bargained,  
sold and delivered, and by these presents do bargain sell and deliver  
unto the said John Thorowgood his Heirs and assigns forever, four  
Negro Slaves to wit Amy, Jeffry, young Ned and Kate, To  
have and to hold the said Negroes Amy, Jeffry, Young Ned  
and Kate with all the future increase of the females of them unto the  
said John Thorowgood his heirs and assigns forever, And I the said

<sup>Eas<sup>t</sup></sup> James Thorowgood for myself my heirs Executors and Administrators  
do hereby agree to warrant and defend the title of the said Negroes unto  
him the said John Thorowgood his heirs, Executors and Administrators  
against the claim of all and every person and persons whatsoever,  
In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this  
third day of June in the Year of our Lord One thousand seven hundred  
and ninety nine.

for my Grand Children, Susannah Hairhouse, James and John Thorowgood  
Children of James Thorowgood and Susannah his wife, and  
for their better promotion and advancement in the World; Have given  
granted and delivered, and by these presents do give grant and deliver  
unto my said three Grand Children, four Negro slaves, which I purchased  
of their Father the said James Thorowgood, that is to say, I give grant and  
deliver unto my Grand daughter Susannah Hairhouse Thorowgood and to  
her heirs forever a Negro Girl called Amy; To my Grandson James Thorowgood  
two negro Slaves called Jeffry and Kate to him and his heirs, To my  
Grandson John Thorowgood and to his heirs, a Negro Boy called young Ned  
To have and to hold the said Negroes Amy, Jeffry, young Ned and  
Kate with the future increase of the females of them unto my said Grand  
Children, Susannah Hairhouse, James, and John Thorowgood and to their heirs  
forever severally and respectively as herein before given, In Witness whereof  
I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this eighth day of  
January in the Year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and one
