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This Indenture made August 30th day in the Year of
our Lord Christ, One thousand Eight hundred, Between William
Cannon of the County of Princeps Anne in the Colony of Virginia on
the one part, and Charles Kenley sen, of the County & Colony aforesaid
of the other part Witneseth, that for and in consideration of the
sum of Ten pounds lawfull money of Virginia to him in hand paid by
the said Charles Kenley Sen, at the sealing and delivery of these presents
the receipt whereof the said William Cannon acknowledgeth, and every
part and parcel thereof, doth acquit, release and discharge, the said Charles
Kenley sen, his heirs, Executors administrators and assigns, forever hath
Granted bargained sold and confirm, and by these presents doth grant
bargain, sell and Confirm unto the said Charles Kenley sen, his heirs and
assigns forever, One certain tract or parcel of Land lying in the County
aforesaid and bounded as followeth Viz^t Beginning at a chertwell Oakward
running thence North degrees East, forty pole and seventeen links to a stake
thence North twenty six degrees west, eight pole and forty links to a map pole thence
South to the first station containing by estimation Three quarters and
Twenty eight pole, of Land more or less, with rents, Issues and profits
thereof, and all the Estate, right, title interest, claim, and demand, what
soever of him the said William Cannon his heirs Ex^{rs}, Adm^{rs} and assigns
of in or to the same and every part and parcel thereof, with the appurtenances
to have and to hold the said tract of Land with all, and singular
the appurtenances, hereby granted, or intended to be granted, unto the said
Charles Kenley sen, his heirs Ex^{rs}, Adm^{rs}, or assigns, to the only proper use, and
behoof of him the said Charles Kenley sen, his heirs, and assigns forever
and the said William Cannon for himself his heirs Ex^{rs}, and Adm^{rs}, doth
covenant to and with the said Charles Kenley sen, his heirs, and assigns
that he the said Charles Kenley sen, his heirs and assigns, shall forever

peaceable and quietly hold possess and enjoy the said Land with the appur
tenances, without the molestation or interruption of any person or persons,
and the said William Cannon, his heirs and assigns, shall and will at any
time, or times hereafter, make execute all such other conveyances or assen
ances, for the better confirming said Land premises, hereby granted, with
the appurtenances without any manner of lett, suit trouble or interruption
of the said William Cannon his heirs Ex^{rs}, Adm^{rs}, from any other person or
persons, whatsoever, well warrant, and for ever assured In Witnes whereof
the said William Cannon hath hereunto set his hand, and seal the day
and year first above written.

This Indenture made this twentieth day of March in the year
of our Lord One thousand eight hundred Nine Between Charles Kenley
Sen, and Jane his wife of the one part, and William Cook of the other being
all of the County of Princeps Anne and Commonwealth of Virginia, Witne
seth that the above said Charles Kenley and Jane his wife, for and in
consideration of Six pounds current money of Virginia to us in hand paid
the receipt whereof we do hereby acknowledge, have bargained sold and deliv
red, and by these presents do grant, sell bargain alien & confirm unto the said
William Cook his heirs and assigns forever exactly one full and complete
Acre of Land, lying and being in the aforesaid County of Princeps Anne
it being part of that parcel or tract of Land which the said Charles
Kenley sen, purchased of William Bushey and beginning at a large pine
near the main road at the corner of the division line between the aforesaid
Charles Kenley and Henry Bushey and running along said line easterly
