This Indenture made this twentieth day of March in the Year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and one Between Charles Kenley Sen, and Jara his wife of the one part, and William Cook of the other being all of the County of Princeps Anne and Commonwealth of Virginia, Witnefs saith that the above said Charles Kenly and Jara his wife, for and in consideration of Six pounds current money of Virginia to us in hand paid the receipt whereof we do hereby acknowledge, have bargained sold and delivered, and by these presents do grant, sell bargain alien and confirm unto the said William Cook, his heirs and Assigns forever exactly one full and complete Acre of Land, lying and being in the aforesaid County of Princeps Anne it being part of that parcel or Tract of Land which the said Charles Kenly sen, purchased of William Bushy and beginning at a large pine near the main road at the corner of the division line between the aforesaid Charles Kenly and Henry Bushy and running along said line easterly
